

The Renewal of the Baptismal Vows

All standing, as able

Through the Paschal mystery, dear friends, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into his death, and raised with him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church.

Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ? **I do.**

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

I will, with God's help.

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

I will, with God's help.

Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ? **I will, with God's help.**

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? **I will, with God's help.**

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

I will, with God's help.

May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

You laid the foundations of the world and enclosed the sea when it burst out from the womb; You brought forth all creatures of the earth and gave breath to humankind.

Wondrous are you, Holy One of Blessing, all you create is a sign of hope for our journey; And so as the morning stars sing your praises we join the heavenly beings and all creation as we shout with joy:

Sanctus

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Glory and honor are yours, Creator of all, your Word has never been silent; you called a people to yourself, as a light to the nations, you delivered them from bondage and led them to a land of promise. Of your grace, you gave Jesus to be human, to share our life, to proclaim the coming of your holy reign and give himself for us, a fragrant offering.

Through Jesus Christ our Redeemer, you have freed us from sin, brought us into your life, reconciled us to you, and restored us to the glory you intend for us.

And so, remembering all that was done for us: the cross, the tomb, the resurrection and ascension, longing for Christ's coming in glory, and presenting to you these gifts your earth has formed and human hands have made, we acclaim you, O Christ:

Dying, you destroyed our death. Rising, you restored our life. Christ Jesus, come in glory!

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts of bread and wine that they may be to us the Body and Blood of your Christ. Grant that we, burning with your Spirit's power, may be a people of hope, justice and love.

Giver of Life, draw us together in the Body of Christ, and in the fullness of time gather us with all your people into the joy of our true eternal home.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, we worship you our God and Creator in voices of unending praise.




Sunday School

2022-2023 NURSERY SCHOOL

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

It is the policy of St. James' Nursery School to allow church members to register their children for new spots in our Preschool Two's, Preschool Three's, and Pre-K Four's classes before registration is open to the public.

Currently enrolled church members, staff, and School Board Members are invited to register early on January 12. Alumni and church members that are not currently enrolled are invited to register on January 24 and 25.

We will be using a link to a Google Registration Form. Please call or email the school to receive the link to register via the google form.

Preschool 2-Year-Old Classes – must be 2 on or before 9/1/22 Preschool 3-Year-Old Classes – must be 3 on or before 9/1/22 Pre-K 4-Year-Old Classes – must be 4 on or before 9/1/22

The registration fee is \$75.00 per child or \$100 for two or more siblings. To be eligible, church members must have been attending and contributing members for a minimum of one year prior to registration. Church members not meeting these criteria are welcome to register during general registration, beginning Wednesday, February 2 at 10:00 AM. The Google Registration Forms will be accessible on this day on our website. Please click on the "Enrollment" tab and find the appropriate form.

Parents will be able to pay the registration fee by sending in a check that week. Registration is not complete until the registration fee is paid. You can drop your check off into the white tuition box outside the double doors. Please make sure to write your child's name on the memo line. Thank you!

If your first choice for class placement is not available, your child will be automatically placed on a change request list. We will have a time stamp for when each family completes their forms, so they will be in order of receipt. We will use this order when filling classes to help keep it fair.
